Bank Failures and Bankruptcies

Robert J. Faris is the U.S. Bankruptcy Judge for the District of Hawaii. He received a B.A. from Reed College in 1980 and his J.D. from the Boalt Hall School of Law, University of California, Berkeley, in 1983. From 1983 until 2002, he practiced with a Honolulu law firm. His practice emphasized business restructurings, insolvency, and commercial litigation. He became a bankruptcy judge in February 2002 and was appointed to the Bankruptcy Appellate Panel of the Ninth Circuit in August 2015. He is a member of the American Bankruptcy Institute, the National Conference of Bankruptcy Judges, and the American College of Bankruptcy.

Professor Charles D. Booth is the Michael J. Marks Distinguished Professor in Business Law & the Director of the Institute of Asian-Pacific Business Law (IAPBL) at the William S. Richardson School of Law. He received his B.A. from Yale University in 1981 and his J.D. from Harvard Law School in 1984. He practiced at Cleary Gottlieb Steen & Hamilton in NYC (1984-86) and taught at Richardson (1986-89) and in the Faculty of Law at the University of Hong Kong (1989-2005) before returning to Richardson in 2006. Prof. Booth's primary research interests are comparative and cross-border insolvency and commercial law.

Prof. Booth has served as a consultant on insolvency and commercial law reform and training projects for many multi-laterals including the World Bank, the Asian Development Bank, and the IMF. He is a Founding Member of the International Insolvency Institute and a member of the American College of Bankruptcy and the International Academy of Commercial and Consumer Law.
