Emeritus Professor Dr. Gordon Walker (LLB & BA, University of Otago; LLM & Dip Ed., University of Adelaide; MBA, University of Sydney; SJD, Duke University School of Law) advises the Asian Development Bank (ADB) on business and capital market law reform in the South Pacific. He is best known internationally for the 13-Volume treatise on international securities regulation published by Westlaw in New York. Current projects for the ADB in 2023 are capital market law reform in PNG and Fiji. As Adjunct Professor at the International College for Digital Innovation at Chiang Mai University he is an instructor in the masters program on Fintech. He served on the World Bank team which prepared a Fintech Strategy for the Seychelles in 2022 and contributed chapters on Fintech in Australia and New Zealand in Maume, Maute and Fromberger, The Law of Crypto Assets (Beck: Munich, 2022).
